

Rules/Referees/Replays/Rulebook - R4 - Justice (F) =FREE

Referees typically demonstrate impartial enforcement of the clear rules of games. When a game call is close, instant replay represents what just happened in slow motion. Promptly enforcing rules, promptly penalizing scoundrel-like acts, & using instant replay for quality control civilizes contested sporting events. The rules are known before a game begins & vibrant reciprocity levels the playing field.

Our legal system might function well using similar elements, delivering justice via clear rules, skilled referees, evidence replays and a complete rulebook – **the four R's - of R4 Justice**. An additional element is needed for a wide variety of particular situations: written contracts that are fair and impartial for the individuals/parties/entities involved.

Systems Engineers suggest that large systems that work have their origins in smaller systems that worked. Making written contracts fair is a worthy first step toward creating an R4 Justice System. Consider this conceptual approach:

The first step is easy to describe: In 2021 pass & ratify...

The Fair Written Contracts Amendment XXVIII

“ In writing contracts, all attorneys involved will represent the interests of all the parties as if every party to the contract were represented individually by a competent attorney. “

Thus the party or parties funding attorney involvement will not have the upper hand in deciding a contract's terms. For example: the terms of all license agreements will balance licensee interests. If the amendment applies to international negotiations, then let it be said: "The signature of even one American attorney assures a square deal."

The Fair Written Contracts Amendment is likely to be a small system that works. If not, then repeal is an option, just as our Prohibition Amendment XVIII of 1919 was repealed by Amendment XXI in 1933.

With step one's fair written contracts stabilizing commercial transactions, The R4 Justice System can be tackled as step two.
