A Current Event:

Earlier this week North Korea started firing artillery rounds onto Yeongpyeong Island (about 70 miles West of Soeul & 90 miles South of P'yongyang); South Korea returned the fire. If the word "**tragedy**" is used to describe *the permanent injury/death of a person or group of people resulting from the unprovoked and intentional actions of another person or group of people...* then the North Korean attack was a tragedy for the South Koreans. A Suggestion:
