What better place to think?

The most important purpose of national government is to peacefully, constructively, and productively shape the expectations of citizens.

... which implies that *having expert planners with extensive experience in the trenches of industries - on staff - whose work will be heeded and communicated - is a prerequisite of being worthy of governing* at the national level. Skillful planning lies at the heart of efficient governance.

If: the expectations of citizens have been peacefully, constructively, and productively shaped;

Then: Citizens will have the option of planning their individual lives throughout their life spans with some assurance of remaining vital contributors to society.

Of necessity, in order to govern well, *who's in charge* at the national level *will matter less and less over time*. **Conversely, gridlocked (i.e.: expectation-indeterminate) national governance has less-than-little merit and deserves prompt mitigation.**
